

# Guidelines for Use of Generative AI in Term Papers

- Submitting a paper that is completely or in part written by GenAI is considered plagiarism and therefore explicitly forbidden.
- Using GenAI as a search engine might result in fake references and/or too many references and/or worsen the citation biases already present in certain general search engines. Students should instead look for references using tools like PhilPapers, the SEP, Google Scholar, or scholarly diversity tools (e.g. [WIP](#) or the [Diversity Reading List](#)).
- Students can be requested by the lecturer to submit a statement of authenticity of their work, possibly also documenting how GenAI has been used in the preparation of the document.
- Teachers may reserve the right to use AI-detection software (turnitiin, copyleaks, ...)
- Final discretion is up to the lecturer.
